





INDEPENDENCE DAY




INTERNATIONAL SEMINAR







SHAKESPEARE & TAGORE







The students of the Department of Bengali and History put up an online cultural programme featuring songs, dance and readings from Tagore.

On 26th January the NSS unit organised a gift distribution programme for the Basic Sunday School of RKSMVV. Around 15 student volunteers participated.







The College Faculty donated Rs. 40,000/- towards the PM Corona Relief Fund, Rs. 75,000/- to the CM Relief Fund.












