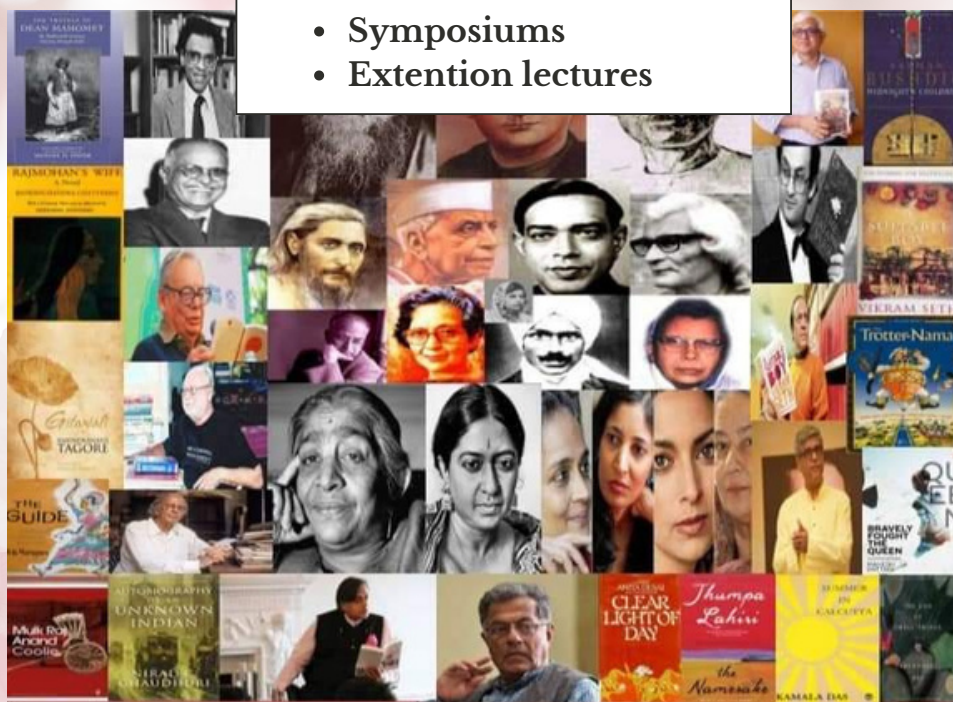
DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

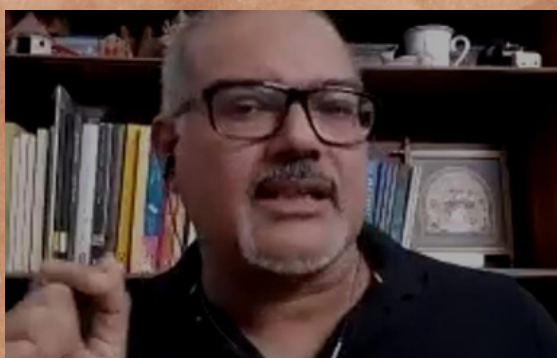
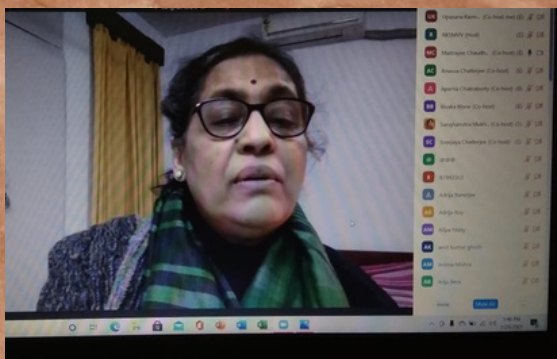
The students of the Department of Bengali and History put up an online cultural programme featuring songs, dance and readings from Tagore.

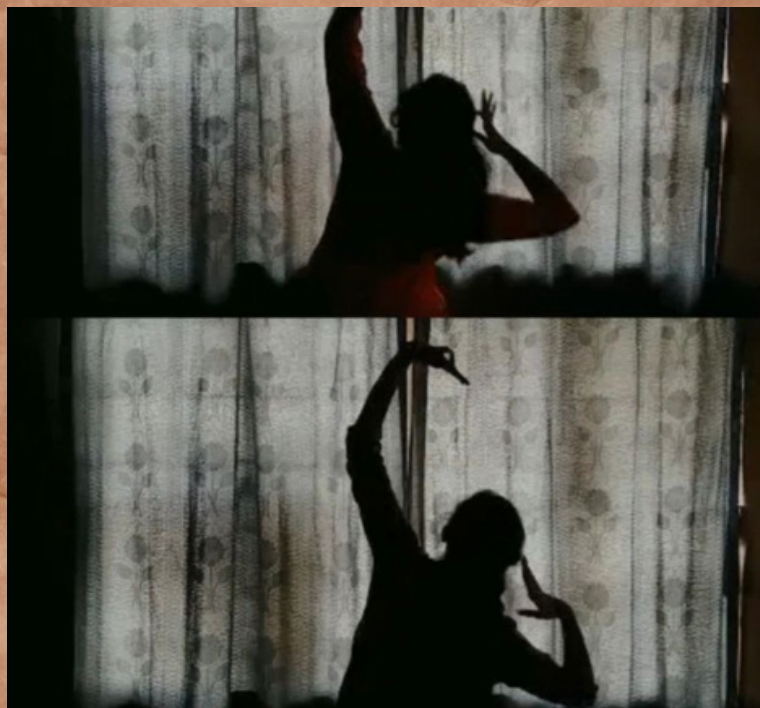
RKSMVV is offering various computer courses in collaboration with Sri Sarada Math, Rasik Bhita.

"From Kabul to Kolkata: Of Memories, Belonging and Identity", a talk by Nazes Afroz, author, translator, photographer and freelance journalist.



"Rabindranath Tagore narrated the story, of a man from a distant land – Afghanistan – but living in Kolkata to earn his living, to his Bengali readers in 1892. Since then, the Kabuliwala has taken a life of its own with translations in many Indian and foreign languages as well as cinematographic adaptations and theatrical performances. Decoding Gender: Interdisciplinary Perspectives

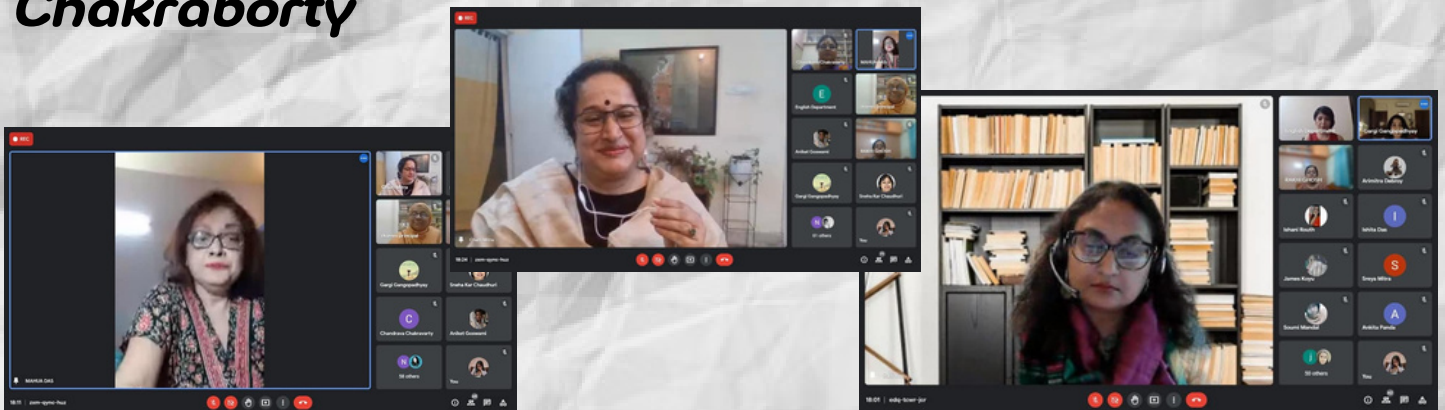

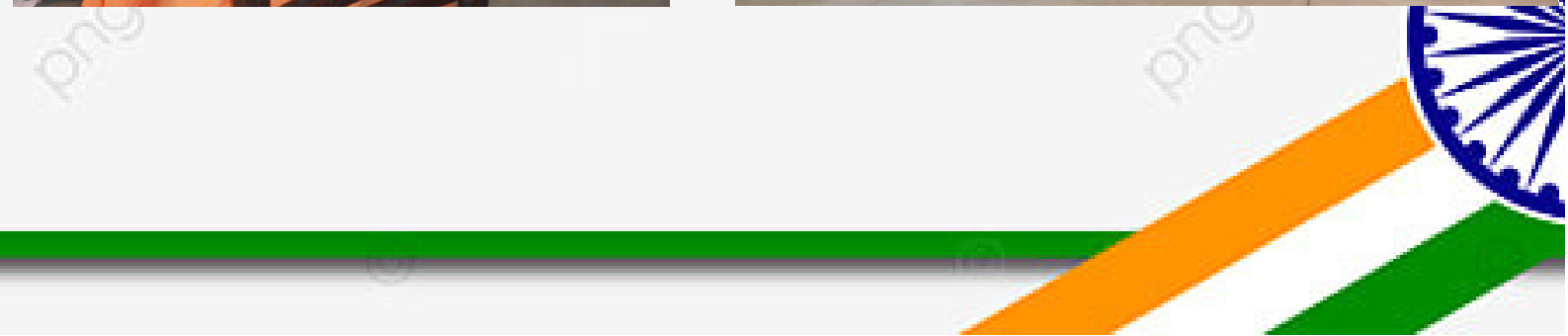
