

SHAKESPEARE & TAGORE







The students of the Department of Bengali and History put up an online cultural programme featuring songs, dance and readings from Tagore.

With a view to extend support to students and help nurture their mental health, the College has also set up a dedicated psychological counselling cell using the expertise and experience of the skilled teachers of the Department of Psychology.







In August 2019, our college instituted the NSS with a view to promote social service and also instill ideas of social welfare, humanity, and philanthropy amongst our students. On 26th January the NSS unit organised a gift distribution programme for the Basic Sunday School of RKSMVV. Around 15 student volunteers participated.







The College Faculty donated Rs. 40,000/- towards the PM Corona Relief Fund, Rs. 75,000/- to the CM Relief Fund.
















Partition Narratives: An Interdisciplinary Lecture Series
