



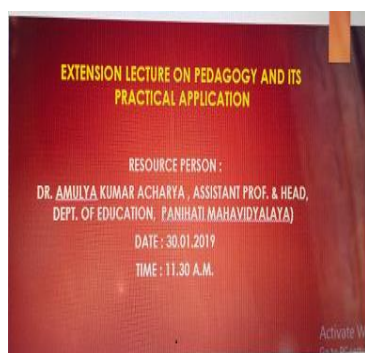

Brief Description and Programme Outcome:

These two topics are newly introduced in our honours syllabus and both are very sensitive and important topics. The two resource persons, Soma and Gargi, both are experienced and knowledgeable persons theoretically and in field. They thoroughly discussed the topics, the laws and amendments and the political problems about POCSO and domestic violence. Students were not much aware about POCSO and Domestic violence.

The students were able to get a clear picture of child abuse and domestic violence in our society. These include: Right to life and survival – A child must be shielded from any kind of physical, psychological, mental and emotional abuse and neglect. Best interests of the child – The primary consideration must be the harmonious development of the child.

We had a scope to know about domestic violence also. It recognises a woman's right to live in a violence-free home. To realize this right, the Act recognises a woman's right to residence and her right to obtain protection orders under the law.

**Brief Description and Programme Outcome:** This programme was arranged for raising awareness on autism. This lectured continued for 2 hours. We invited to speak on this sensitive topic, Sangita, who is mother of an autistic child herself. She expressed the topic very beneficially to the students. “All too often, I’ll come across a sharing on social media by parents who have a child with autism experiencing misunderstandings from a member of the public”, our resource person Sangita said. In this sharing, she recalled that the child had a sensory meltdown in public and a lady made comments such as “What an awful child? Who are his parents?” These judgmental attitudes and comments stemming from ignorance can deeply upset individuals with autism and their family members. Public awareness clears up stereotypes and misunderstandings, and serves as a form of emotional support for parents and caregivers. Keeping this in mind we arranged this lecture. In the second session the speaker was Sm. Shukla Das Barua. She showed us many art and craft works done by differently abled children especially autistic ones. The whole session was very fruitful as it cleared up misunderstandings and stereotyped concept about autism.
