- Name of Course: Post Graduate Diploma in Psychological Counselling
- Provided by: Ramakrishna Sarada Mission Vivekananda Vidyabhavan and Sister Nivedita University (Techno India Group)
- Duration: Two Years (including practical classes and internships)
- Mode: Direct Teaching will be conducted by Offline classes only. No online classes.
- The Course is for FEMALE students only
- Course Fee: Per Year : 25,000/-+5,000/- (Practical) = 30,000/-
- NOTE: Apart from the Course fee students have to do 40 sessions of SELF COUNSELLING compulsory at their own expense (Rs. 250/- per session) For 30 sessions supervision charge of Rs. 250/-per session has to be paid to the supervisor.
