- Only one submission will be allowed per student.

SPOTLIGHT ON SHAKESPEARE (Skit Competition)

RULES

- Skits must be based on any Shakespearean work.
- Performances should not exceed the given time limit of 3 minutes.
- No vulgar or abusive language, no persecution of any community, religion or gender will be allowed.
- No plagiarism.
- Participants are encouraged to incorporate Shakespeareaninspired costumes and props to enhance the authenticity and visual appeal of their performances.



TOTE-ALLY SHAKESPEARE (A Tote Bag Painting Contest)

We invite participants to unleash their creativity by transforming ordinary tote bags into works of art as we commemorate the timeless legacy of Shakespeare. The prompt for the contest will be provided on the spot.

RULES

- The tote bags will be provided by us. Each participant will be entitled to a single tote bag and no extra will be given on the pretext of mishandling of the previous one.
- Participants may use various painting techniques and mediums to create their designs. The use of stencils, stamps and other embellishments are permitted.
- Participants must bring their own materials and brushes.
- Designs should be original.
- There will be a designated time frame to complete their tote bag paintings during the event.

** All offline competitions will be held on the day of the event, 29.04.2024, at Ramakrishna Sarada Mission Vivekananda Vidyabhavan premises.

*** Participants for offline competitions will be required to pay a registration fees of Rs. 100/- on the spot, on the day of the event.

**** the online competitions are open to all students while the offline ones, to be held in the campus, are open to girl students only.
