Overall Assessment and Comments

About the College

RKSMVV is a premier girls' college in Kolkata dedicated to quality education and holistic development of young minds. Built under the auspices of Sarada Math, this College is situated in a lush and sprawling campus, and is free of political disruptions, providing an excellent academic environment.

The prestigious 60 year old institution has academic buildings with modern teaching-learning infrastructure. As a recipient of the RUSA 2.0 Infrastructure Grant, the College is expanding with a new academic wing and a refurbished students' canteen.

The college follows the CBCS semester system, as mandated by the UGC. It offers 11 Honours courses (Bengali, Economics, Education, English, Geography, History, Journalism and Mass Communication, Philosophy, Political Science, Sanskrit, Sociology) and 14 General courses (Human Rights, Mathematics and Psychologyin addition to the Honours subjects) at the undergraduate level and a postgraduate programme in Philosophy. The number of students in the 2020-2021 session was 439, while the 2021-2022 session had 464 students. The faculty strength was 56 for both sessions.

The College offers a number of value added courses in addition to the prescribed curriculum. The College has formed collaborations with reputed organizations like the Sister Nivedita University (Techno India Group), National Skill Development Corporation, Sri Sarada Math Rasik Bhita

and Elta Global for conducting these courses. 8 courses were offered during 2020-2021, and 7 during 2021-2022.

The college is recognized by UGC under 2(f) and 12(B).

The college was last accredited by NAAC in 2016 with A grade, with a CGPA of 3.07.

The VISION of the college is to impart integral and holistic education tempered with compassion, conscience and competence; and uplift and empowerment of women through education.

- Gradual emphasis on Outcome Based Education (OBE), in addition to learner centric teaching-learning. PO CO prepared and communicated.
- Consistently good results at the university exams, laudable success rate. Negligible or no dropouts.
- Placement Cell in place.
- Several co curricular courses offered.
- Tradition of strong and well-structured value education and motivational spiritual training following the Vision of the college.
- Active participation of students in outreach or community service programmes including NSS.
- Well stocked, spacious library. Automated and digitized.
- The RKSMVV Journal of Human Sciences provides scope for faculty research publication.
- Registered Alumni Association with motivated and active alumni.

Areas of Weakness:

- Paucity of funds.
- Inadequate teaching and non-teaching staff, several sanctioned posts lying vacant.
- Few departments with inadequate teaching faculty.
- Regulatory prohibition of appointment of Guest Faculty has resulted in difficulty to conduct the stipulated number of classes.
- Limited scope for excursions and field trips owing to non-availability of funds.
- Low student strength, reserved seats not filled up due to lack of qualified applicants.
- Lacking in innovative teaching and learning, due to pressure of syllabus completion within limited time.
