- The Indian Constitution is set up to ensure equal rights to everyone and to entitle people with the power to select their leader, practice their religion and choose the work portfolio that they like.
- •The final objective of this Course, through the lens of the Constitution, is to help one realize that an understanding of the Constitution is necessary to fulfill the aspirations of all the people in society and create conditions for a just and secular country.
