Brief description of the event: An open discussion on Jallianwala Bagh Massacre: A Landmark in the Struggle for Freedom was organised by the Department of Human Rights on 13th April, 2024 at Room no 37. April 13, 1919, is immortalised in history as a black day for it bore witness to one of the most brutal and defining episodes of British colonial rule – the Jallianwala Bagh Massacre. Jallianwala Bagh is a living symbol of the cruelty and inhumanity of British rule. This massacre awakened the revolutionary flame hidden in the hearts of the countrymen and made the freedom movement a struggle of the people.

Programme Outcome - The Jallianwala Bagh massacre marked a turning point in India's struggle for Independence. A memorial was set up by the Government of India in 1951 at Jallianwala Bagh to commemorate the spirit of Indian revolutionaries and the people who lost their lives in the brutal massacre.
