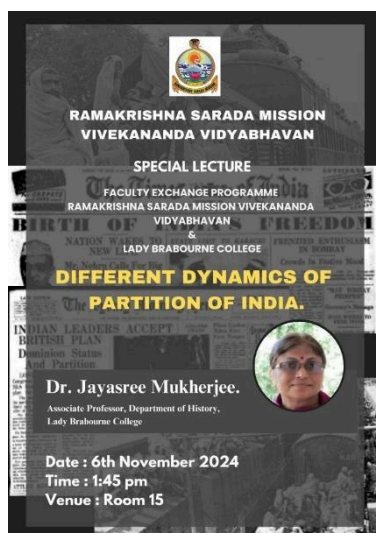

**Brief Description of the Event:** This special lecture is aimed at discussing some of the issues connected to the Partition of India in 1947. Dr Mukhopadhyay emphasised the background of Communalism and the events and issues culminating to the Partition.

**Programme Outcome:** The interaction at the end of the special lecture showed that many questions were sparked off. The moot question was whether the Partition was inevitable or whether it was a sole handiwork of the “Muslims”. The students were enriched by this lecture which made it clear that the British rulers, the Indian National Congress, the Hindu Mahasabha and the Muslim League were all involved in dividing India into two unequal halves on the basis of the Two Nation theory, advocated by the Muslim League and the Hindu Mahasabha
