

Brief Description of the Event: This Event focuses on special interactive lectures by Fifth Semester students on both curricular and non-curricular issues. First Semester and Third students actively engaged and showed keen interest on the PPT presentations on *Women, Not Highlighted in the Nationalist Movements of Bengal* and on *Some Aspects of the Bengal Renaissance* event was conceptualised to evaluate the relationship of courage and bravery of Shahid Pritilata Waddedar and the RG Kar movement for justice.

Programme Outcome: This programme was successful so far as the initial goal was set. It motivated both Peer Groups to teach and learn using ICT facilities. This was the first exposure of First Semester students to women's issues in the history of Nationalist Movement of India.
