
1. Name of the Event: Micro-Teaching Session on the Restoration Age

Brief Description of the Event: The department of English organized a micro-teaching session wherein Semester VI students conducted an interactive and informative class for their juniors from Semester IV on the 'Restoration Age'. The session introduced students to the socio-political milieu of the Restoration period, examining the return of monarchy under Charles II, the shifting moral landscape, and the intellectual responses it provoked. Emphasis was laid on how the political



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upheavals and emerging urban culture shaped literary outputs. Particular attention was given to the theatrical developments of the time highlighting their significance in the broader literary and cultural framework of the age

Outcome: The micro-teaching session fostered collaborative learning and peer



engagement. Semester IV students gained a well-rounded initiation into the age, enriched by contextual understanding and lively examples from literary texts and stage practices. Also, the session fostered academic cooperation and leadership among students.
