

Brief Description of the Event: This Seminar aimed at imparting knowledge on two important ancient Epics of India.

Dr. Kanad Sinha's topic was 'Reading the Mahabharata: A Text of Multiple Nature'. Dr, Biswas spoke on 'Reading the Mughal Mind through Ramayana of Hamida Bano'. The topic evoked interest among the faculty and students from the departments of English, Sanskrit and Education as well as those from History.

Outcome of the Event: This session generated great interest on the debates related to the two epics—their historicity, discourse on war, perception of Ramayana in the Mughal Period. Both the speakers handled intricate issues in a language understandable to students. Dr Sinha explained how shruti/orality transformed into written texts.
