Brief Description of the Event: The programme opened with a video presentation highlighting the current landscape of unemployment and employment in India. This introductory audio–visual segment created a meaningful backdrop for the discussions that followed, helping students grasp the real-world workforce challenges that shape the contemporary job sector.

An introductory speech was then delivered by Mr. Shonku, who welcomed the participants and outlined the purpose of the industrial visit, emphasising the importance of bridging academic learning with industry expectations. The next segment featured alumni accounts, where former students shared their journeys and professional experiences. Some spoke on stage, while others joined virtually through video calls, offering a blend of perspectives. Their stories provided motivation and demonstrated multiple pathways into the professional world. A panel discussion followed, with five panelists engaging the students on topics such as essential soft skills, connecting academia and industry, building a personal brand, and aligning classroom learning with present-day job sectors.

This flowed into an interactive Q&A session, where students actively posed questions shaped by the panel discussion. A quiz session added an engaging competitive spirit, focusing on themes covered throughout the programme. The event then presented a talk on Artificial Intelligence, explaining its applications and rising significance. This segment concluded with the distribution of prizes and recognitions, including awards presented to alumni.

The programme also featured a cultural segment, offering musical performances such as folksongs and classical songs, adding a vibrant and celebratory tone to the day. The event

concluded with ending remarks, a warm vote of thanks, and the serving of refreshments to all attendees.

Outcome of the Event: The industrial visit to TCS, organized on the occasion of National Education Day, proved to be a meaningful academic–industry linkage initiative, significantly enriching the students' understanding of emerging professional landscapes. The event enabled participants to witness firsthand how a major global IT organisation functions, while also gaining insights into employment trends, workplace expectations, and future skill requirements. One of the central outcomes was the enhancement of career awareness among the students. The initial video presentation on unemployment and employment statistics in India offered an eye-opening context, illustrating the challenges young graduates face and the competencies they must cultivate. This formed the foundation for later discussions, helping students internalize the urgency of skill development.

The alumni interactions—both live and virtual—served as an encouraging bridge between student life and professional progression. Hearing authentic experiences allowed participants to visualise concrete career trajectories and understand the significance of adaptability, resilience, and continuous learning. The panel discussion proved to be a transformative segment. Students gained clarity on the soft skills required for professional success, the necessity of connecting academic knowledge with real industry demands, and the importance of crafting and sustaining a personal brand in an increasingly competitive job market. The conversation about linking classroom learning to today's employment ecosystem empowered students to reinterpret their studies in a more practical manner.

The Q&A and quiz sessions further stimulated active learning, reinforcing key points and promoting confidence in public interaction. The talk on Artificial Intelligence introduced them to one of the most influential technologies shaping the global workforce, enhancing their awareness of future-ready skills.

The cultural performances not only uplifted the atmosphere but also showcased the holistic talents of the students, reinforcing the value of creativity alongside technical competence. Overall, the event nurtured professional readiness, broadened perspectives, and strengthened the bridge between academia and industry—making it a valuable educational experience.
